## Welcome to Fall!

This year is moving quickly but that could just be old man talk? It feels that way to this old man any way. As we come out of the summer NC 811 continues to experience month over month increases. While we continue to hire and train new CSRs, the volume is overwhelming on Mondays and after holidays. We ask your patience with the center and if you are able to utilize the electronic methods to create tickets, please consider SAT or RTE.

Total annual volume is up roughly 7% over 2023.

In other notes NC 811 continues to educate and work through the changes to the statute with all stakeholders. Hats off to Justus and the AGC as well for their contributions on your behalf to the language under consideration. The goal is to have a workable bill ready by end of this year to be submitted in the 2025 session. One key change, extending the life from 15 working days to 28 calendar days, is hoped to relieve some of the update volume as we brace for more fiber work with expected increases tied to release of grant monies.

I look forward to sharing more about the proposed language, the upcoming CGA DIRT report and general state of damage prevention in NC at the conference on October 11th!

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## Industry News and Advocacy

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### **Congressional Update: Work Remains Ahead For NUCA Priorities**

Congress returned to Washington on Sept. 9 and their month is shaping up to be a busy one. A major backlog of important bills has built up – including NUCA priorities like the Water Resources Development Act (WRDA), reauthorization of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act, and passing strong damage prevention language as part of the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA) reauthorization. Congress must grapple with the fate of these important bills while also facing a growing showdown over the FY2025 spending bills.

The deadline for Congress to pass all 12 annual FY2025 appropriations bills or pass a Continuing Resolution (CR) to avoid a government shutdown is Sept. 30. A full spending agreement is not realistically possible by the deadline, so negotiations have pivoted to a CR to keep funding flat for a predetermined period.

House Republicans have pressed for a six-month CR to punt the deadline into the new year, and leave the new President and new Congress more room to maneuver rather than face a crunch in the post-election Lamé Duck session. House Republicans seek to include the SAVE Act in the CR, a bill which requires proof-of-citizenship before registering to vote in a federal election. The Senate and the White House are unlikely to agree to a six-month extension that also includes the SAVE Act, so the stakes are high for both parties to avoid a government shutdown the month before Election Day.

### **EPA Announces \$7.5 Billion In Water Infrastructure Financing**

On Sept. 6 the EPA announced the availability of \$7.5 billion of Water Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act (WIFIA) funding. The WIFIA program offers low-cost, long-term loans to help communities build local water infrastructure projects. This is the program's eighth funding round over the last ten years.

EPA wrote it is prioritizing projects focused on disadvantaged communities, replacing lead service lines, and addressing PFAS and other contaminants. To qualify for the program, projects should be estimated to costs at least \$20 million, or \$5 million for small communities of less than 25,000 people. WIFIA loans can cover up to 49% of eligible costs, or 80% of costs in small community projects.

NUCA's advocacy efforts on Capitol Hill continue to show results. NUCA has been a strong supporter of the WIFIA program since it was established in 2014. Growing our membership will only strengthen our ability to keep programs like this fully funded.

### **2024 Trench Safety Stand Down (TSSD) Season Concludes**

TSSD officially ends each year on Sept. 1, but the lessons learned last all year. This year's industry-wide event held June 17-21 reinforced a basic fact to all attendees: safety training is critical to a well-functioning utility construction jobsite and an employee's daily activity. For the 2024 events, 24,198 employees participated in a stand down training event held by 507 companies on 2,143 jobsites. NUCA thanks each company and employee who participated in our safety season, and who sent us their reports and photos for the upcoming September/October issue of Utility Contractor magazine.
